

GODOX OFF CAMERA FLASH KIT: WHAT & THE COST?

If you are considering purchasing your first off camera flash set up without spending a fortune what equipment do you need and how much should you spend to get started?

Godox make a wide range of flash photography products to suit various needs and pockets, but perhaps one of their most versatile products that really put them on the map has been their Godox AD200.

The cheapest light and transmitter pair, to get you started with off camera flash is the Godox TT600 flash (£60.00) and the Godox X1 trigger (£40.00). In relation to affordability you are getting solid features including TTL and HSS which are all controllable wirelessly from the trigger on your camera. So, for under £100 pound you can get started and if you buy second hand you might even be able to start for under £70? The TT600 takes four AA batteries and the X1 trigger takes two AA batteries.

Once you have used a flash off camera you will soon realise that you will need a light stand and bracket, together with a modifier to really take advantage of the light (A PDF on Getting Started with Modifiers will be available soon)

Although the Godox TT600 flash and the Godox X1 trigger will get you started, if you really want to take advantage of Off camera flash, the Godox AD200 will enable to do far more and it's removable 2900mAh Lithium Battery will provide 500 power pops at full power.

Prior to Godox AD200, there were no flashes with interchangeable heads and in relation to its size, if you wanted 200-watt seconds of power, you had to group flashes together. The Godox AD200 is such a versatile light and use the bare bulb in a light modifier and you will clearly see why the AD200 has become so popular.

The price of a Godox AD200 is about £270, but for the price, the features, power and versatility are worth it in my opinion. If you look on the web you can find some great combo deals that start at around £320.
